


Sam has shown great resilience this week. He persevered with his narrative writing and even when he had to rewrite the ending he remained positive. The improvements he made were impressive. Well done!

FAMWORK

Emperor Penguins are one of the most resilient creatures on the planet. They live in the coldest windiest place on Earth – The Antarctic where temperatures regularly plummet below -40°c. To reach their breeding grounds they trek over 75 miles and then survive for months without food as they rear their chicks.

Being resilient when learning means keeping going when things are difficult. It means remaining positive even when learning is hard and being able to respond to advice and encouragement from other people.

Monarch Butterflies are immensely creative...so creative they have the ability to transform from an egg, to a caterpillar, to a chrysalis and into a beautiful butterfly. As well as this amazing metamorphosis, this king of butterflies is unmissable with its stunning colouring and patterns.

Creative learners look for interesting and unusual ways to solve problems or complete tasks. They show excitement and flair, enjoying experimenting with new ideas and approaches. Creativity can produce beautiful art work, captivating stories or clever inventions.

Learners express their ideas well through their oral contributions using creative vocabulary.

Otters are very curious creatures. As you walk beside the a river, you may be lucky to see their little heads poke out of the water to have a look around and try to work out what is happening. Its head turns from side to side to absorb as much information as possible.

Curious learners are always asking questions. They understand that asking questions enables them to find out more and make links between things they already know and new information. Curiosity will drive learners to carry on their learning, even when they are not at school. They will research things they are interested in at home and be keen to share their learning with others.

Dolphins show kindness to each other but also have been known to help another species. For example, a kindly pod of dolphins saved a seal by preventing it from being washed up on a beach. Dolphins have even been known to help injured humans and whales.

Kindness is doing something and not expecting anything in return. Kindness is respect and helping others without waiting for someone to help you back. Kindness usually involves doing something to make someone else's life easier or happier.

Meerkats live in the African Kalahari desert and would be unlikely to survive if it were not for their amazing teamwork. Whilst some meerkats dig for food, others stand guard, watching for predators. They communicate continuously with each other and in the event of danger, stick together.

Good teamwork is when people to work cooperatively towards a shared aim. For a team to work well, everyone has to show respect in everyone else's abilities and opinions. There has to be good communication and listening and everyone has to be willing to include, share and contribute.
