New Head Teacher

This has been a very significant week at Little Stoke Primary when our Governors have successfully recruited a new Head Teacher to begin after Christmas.

The Governors, under the confident leadership of Scott Pells and Kirstie Wilmot, have worked with the local authority to find the best possible candidate and after a successful two-day, rigorous interview process have recruited Dan Ross. As Scott details in his letter, Dan Ross will be very keen to continue all the many strengths already in place, particularly linked to child-centred learning, parent participation and community links.
