



MATHEMATICS

As Mathematicians, we will be focusing on place value within 20 representing, comparing and ordering numbers. Additionally, we will learn to use different strategies for addition and subtraction within 20 using practical equipment such as number lines, tens frames and part-whole plates.

ENGLISH

As Writers, we will be using Jack and the Beanstalk and A walk In London to inspire us. We will focus on consolidating the objectives that we have covered so far, sequencing sentences to form short narratives and beginning to use question marks.

ART/DT

SCIENCE

As Scientists, we will be focusing on materials. We will learn that objects are made out of a range of materials and understand why they are used.

Additionally, we will describe, group and compare different materials and objects according to their properties.
