Uniform Expectations

As we start the new year, we want all children to feel proud and ready for learning by wearing the correct school uniform. Please check the list below to make sure your child is prepared for the first day back:

General Uniform

- **Royal blue** jumper/cardigan/fleece (logo optional)
- **Royal blue** or white polo shirt (logo optional)
- Grey or black school trousers, skirt, pinafore, or grey school shorts
- Blue checked summer dress (summer term only)
- **Plain black shoes or plain black trainers** (no logos, stripes, or heels)
- Black, grey, navy, or white socks/tights (plain colours)

PE Kit

- Plain white T-shirt
- Plain navy or black shorts, tracksuit bottoms, or leggings
- Royal blue jumper/cardigan/fleece (usual school jumper)
- Black trainers or plimsolls

Forest School

- Old jumper/t-shirt/trousers
- Wellies or sturdy trainers
- Waterproof coat and trousers
- Seasonal extras: hat, gloves, scarf, suncream

Additional Notes

- Long hair should be tied back for PE.
- No jewellery except plain stud earrings and small religious items.
- No make-up or nail varnish.
- Smart watches are not permitted.
- Please name all items to avoid loss.

Our EYFS and Key Stage 1 children delighted audiences with their nativity performance, ***Everyone Loves a Baby***. With joyful singing, confident performances and plenty of festive cheer, the children retold the Christmas story in a warm and engaging way.



From shepherds and stars to Mary, Joseph and a very special baby, every child played their part beautifully. The message of love, kindness and celebration shone through, and the children's enthusiasm was a joy to watch.

Well done to all the EYFS and KS1 children and staff for a wonderful Christmas performance.

Year 3 pupils have been getting hands-on with clay this term, creating their own pottery inspired by the work of celebrated ceramic artist Kate Malone. The project gave children the opportunity to explore shape, texture and colour while learning about a contemporary British artist.

After studying examples of Kate Malone's bold and expressive ceramics, the children experimented with different techniques, including shaping, smoothing and adding decorative details. They worked carefully and creatively, producing a range of unique pieces that reflected Malone's distinctive use of form and vibrant surface design.

The project not only developed the children's artistic skills but also encouraged patience, problem-solving and pride in their work. The finished pots were a real achievement, and Year 3 were excited to see their creations come to life.

Well done to all the Year 3 pupils for their enthusiasm and creativity.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Meet Your Educational Mental Health Practitioner (EMHP)...

Daria

Hi I'm Daria (she/her) from the Mental Health Support Team. I'll be working at your school each week, say hello next time you see me!



Starting from this term I will be working at Little Stoke Primary every Tuesday. I am going to be supporting students with anxiety, low mood, and other struggles with wellbeing. I will be using a type of therapy called low-intensity Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT). The support I will be offering will include:

- Working with students on a 1-1 basis to show them ways that they can take care of their mental health.
- Working with parents to give them new ideas for supporting their child's mental health.
- Supporting a 'whole-school approach' to Mental Health, supporting student wellbeing by delivering group workshops, creating resources and lots more!

If you think your child could benefit from some support please speak to a member of staff in school, they will reach out to me and we can discuss how we can best help you. If we can help, we will arrange a 'meet and greet' session, where I can tell you a little bit more about the support I can offer.
